Pratia angulata

- **Use:** Makes an excellent, dense groundcover or is great interplanted between spring flowering bulbs. Also good as filler between stepping stones. Tolerates varying amounts of foot traffic. Use in damp areas where you need to fill in quickly.
- Exposure/Soil: Prefers partial sunlight to mostly shady areas. Nearly any type of moist, well-drained soil is suitable. Like most mint plants, it self-seeds readily and can be somewhat aggressive if left unchecked so keep it in a contained area. It likes consistent but not constant moisture, and if it gets too wet its leaves may turn into a black and slimy unsightly mess.
- **Growth:** Grows 1-2" tall and continues to spread by underground roots. Roots when stems come in contact with the soil. Can spread indefinitely over time.
- Hardiness: Zone 6-9 Perennial
- Foliage: Fragrant edible leaves. We do love running our hands across it though and taking that scent with us.
- **Flower:** In spring white starry flowers with purple veins appear, followed in autumn with reddish-purple fruit.
