

Blue Oakleaf Primrose



They're easy to grow, highly fragrant and will add some much needed color to brighten up your garden during the winter months.

Primula vulgaris 'Oakleaf Blue' PPAF

- **Use:** Another colorful addition to the Oakleaf series of primrose with blue-violet flowers with a bright yellow center. It's unique, oak-leaf-shaped foliage provides a wonderful backdrop to the numerous flowers. This is an extremely hardy variety that will be a consistent performer in the garden. Nice for a shade garden with some dappled sun. We know spring is here when the primroses are blooming!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Moist, well-drained soil. Keep water off the leaves and flowers for best results. Beware of slugs and snails.
- **Growth:** Grows 18" tall and 14" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Unusual undulating lobed leaves form a lush rosette.
- **Flower:** Displays deep purple-blue flowers with bright yellow eyes that are striking in early spring. They come back every year!
