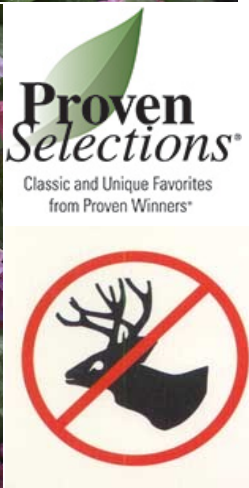


Pretty In Pink Lungwort



Pulmonaria 'Pretty In Pink'

- **Use:** Lungworts are invaluable perennials for a woodland or wildlife garden, but are equally happy at the front of the border. They are grown for their early flowers, which are attractive to bees, and unusual foliage, often spotted silver or white. Plants make good trouble-free groundcover for moist shade, spreading slowly and requiring little care. Rabbit and deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Perform best in compost-enriched soils with regular irrigation. Dry conditions can lead to powdery mildew and leaf scorch. Clean up in the spring by removing old or damaged foliage from the previous year.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; reaches 1 ft. tall, spreading 2 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green leaves are lightly to moderately speckled with silver, so you can enjoy the interesting foliage after it has finished blooming.
- **Flower:** Large, bright rose pink flowers stay consistently pink and are produced in large flower clusters in early spring providing nectar for the first bees and other pollinators
