

Trevi Fountain Lungwort



Deer Resistant and loves the shade! Works well under deciduous trees and along woodland pathways.



Pulmonaria 'Trevi Fountain'

- **Use:** Lungworts are invaluable perennials for a woodland or wildlife garden, but are equally happy at the front of the border. They are grown for their early flowers, which are attractive to bees, and unusual foliage, often spotted silver or white. Plants make good trouble-free groundcover for moist shade, spreading slowly and requiring little care. Rabbit and deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Perform best in compost-enriched soils with regular irrigation. Dry conditions can lead to powdery mildew and leaf scorch. Clean up in the spring by removing old or damaged foliage from the previous year.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; reaches 1 ft. tall, spreading 2 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Long, elliptical, fuzzy leaves of medium green, covered with silvery speckles extending to cover almost the entire leaf surface. Clumps may be easily divided in early fall.
- **Flower:** Profuse clusters of showy cobalt-blue spring flowers and silver-spotted leaves add showy color to shady borders.
