Salvia leucantha

- <u>Use:</u> This Mexican native has narrow, aromatic gray-green leaves with wooly white undersides. The velvety purple flower spikes produced during the spring and summer attract hummingbirds. Plant in filtered sun and provide moderate irrigation in the summer.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in filtered sun to partial sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Drought tolerant once established
- <u>Growth</u>: Full, well branched plants grow QUICKLY to 3-4' tall and wide in one season..
- *Hardiness: Zone* 7b-10 perennial. Very heat tolerant! Mulch around plant in the winter.
- *Foliage:* Fragrant, green leaves. Deciduous. Cutting grown. Pinch back tips occasionally for a super bushy plant.
- Flower: Flower spikes are covered with spike of fuzzy, purple flowers that are just outstanding! Nonstop profusion of color from May until late October!
