## Snowhill Salvia



Looking for a summer show color? Easy to grow, salvias perform best in full sun. For the greatest impact in the garden, plant in drifts!





## Salvia nemerosa 'Snowhill'

- <u>Use:</u> An exceptionally long bloomer with numerous spikes of bright white flowers set against gray-green, aromatic foliage. A wonderful easy care choice for planting in drifts or spotting into a sunny mixed border or wild garden. The flowers are long-lasting in arrangements. Fairly drought tolerant once established and deer resistant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in full sun to partial sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Must have good drainage. Drought tolerant once established
- <u>Growth</u>: Moderate growing, bushy habit; reaches 18-20 in. tall and wide.
- *Hardiness: Zone* 5-9 perennial. Mulch around plant in the winter.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Its foliage is aromatic when crushed.
- <u>Flower:</u> Pure white flower spikes put on a marvelous show beginning in early summer and continue well into the summer if deadheaded. Nonstop profusion of color from April until late October! Trim back occasionally to keep a tidy plant.
