Valley High Catchfly



The slightly sticky flower stems of Silene Valley High have earned it the common name Catchfly.

Silene 'Valley High'

- <u>Use:</u> Strongly contrasting variegation with a large green center surrounded by cream to white margins. Profuse rose pink flowers in May. It will rebloom in the fall if it is cut back. Back by popular demand. A great garden performer. Plant several in a sunny border to lazily meander like a river throughout.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers morning sun and afternoon shade, but may grow in full sun if on an irrigation system. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Needs good drainage and minimal fertilization.
- *Growth:* Grows 10-13" tall and 13" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-9; Perennial.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Bold variegated foliage, green edged in creamy yellow.
- Flower: Bold variegated foliage, green edged in creamy yellow
