

# Lucerne Blue Eyed Grass



**We love them for their continually opening sky blue blooms.**



## *Sisyrinchium 'Lucerne'*

- **Use:** Blue eyed grass will WOW you with their continuous blossoms. Not actually a grass, but rather a relative of irises. Once established we find them to fairly drought tolerant. A casual spreader that makes a lovely selection for the informal, naturalized garden. Bright blue, star-shaped flowers with gold centers rise above diminutive, iris-like foliage. Excellent for edging or the front of mixed borders.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers partial sun, but may grow in full sun if on an irrigation system. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Prefers a moist location.
- **Growth:** Can reach 6-12" tall and will spread into a clump of 2' wide.
- **Hardiness:** 3-10 Perennial. More sterile than other cultivars. Native to Missouri.
- **Foliage:** The leaves, which resemble miniature iris foliage, form a dense, turf-like clump.
- **Flower:** The 1/2" diameter flowers are blue with gold centers. They appear from late spring through early summer.
