

Suwannee Blue Eyed Grass



Sisyrinchium 'Suwannee'

- **Use:** Blue eyed grass will WOW you with their continuous blossoms. Found by plantsman Charles Webb in Madison County, Florida, on the limestone banks of the Suwannee River. Not actually a grass, but rather a relative of irises. Once established we find them to be fairly drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers partial sun, but may grow in full sun if on an irrigation system. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Prefers a moist location. Great when you need a plant to tolerate wet soil.
- **Growth:** Can reach 6-12" tall and will spread into a clump of 2' wide. It is very different from our typical weedy *Sisyrinchium angustifolium*. It produces a beautiful floral show of any *Sisyrinchium* on the market while not littering the ground with seedlings.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-10; Perennial.
- **Foliage:** **Semievergreen;** The leaves, which resemble miniature iris foliage, form a dense, turf-like clump.
- **Flower:** The 1/2" diameter flowers are starry blue with gold centers. They appear from late spring through early summer.

We love them for their continually opening sky blue blooms.
