Little Lemon Goldenrod



- Thrives in poor to fertile soil conditions.
- Planted in mass, as a border or in a mixed container, it is a long-blooming perennial that is a must-have for all butterfly gardens.

- <u>Use</u>: Little Lemon is a hybrid Goldenrod that blooms in midsummer with full, bright lemon-yellow flower spikes held over small compact plants. This dwarf variety is great for smaller gardens where other Goldenrods would be too large. A seasonextending bloomer for the perennial garden and containers, this light gold color is the perfect complement for fall leaves and big orange pumpkins.
- **<u>Exposure/Soil</u>**: Full to part sun. Prefers well-drained soil. Drought tolerant once established.
- <u>Growth</u>: From a slowly spreading rhizome, the stalks emerge upward in late spring, topping out at 12-18" tall and 18-24" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-9; Perennial
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. The leaves are rough, long, and thin.
- <u>Flower:</u> Golden yellow sprays of flowers from late summer to fall frosts. Cut back when it is done blooming for a second flush of flowers.
