Stachys byzantina "Balstaclamb" PP35738

- <u>Use:</u> Velvety-soft, greenish-silver leafy plant stays compact and is great for edging, border gardens and containers. Very heat tolerant selection. Pair with grasses and purple or blue flowers for a pop in the garden. Garden visitors, especially children, will enjoy the soft feel of the foliage. An excellent low-maintenance option for edging a path, or as a low border planting. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun-part shade(6+ hours sun at least though). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Watering under foliage is best as they dislike wet leaves and sprinklers.
- **Growth:** Quickly reaches 14" tall and 18" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4a-9; Perennial
- *Foliage:* Semi-evergreen; 4 inch long velvety, chartreuse, soft, lamb's ear-shaped leaves with tiny white hairs
- <u>Flower</u>: Not known for flowers, but a light lilac flowers arise on stalks in summer.
