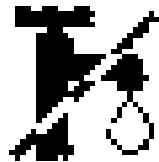


Key Lime Lamb's Ears



We love the strength and versatility of this plant. They really add texture and color to the garden!

Stachys byzantine 'Key Lime'

- **Use:** A new chartreuse foliated lamb's ear to add new interest in your garden. Pair with grasses and purple or blue flowers for a pop in the garden. Garden visitors, especially children, will enjoy the soft feel of the foliage. An excellent low-maintenance, non-flowering option for edging a path, or as a low border planting. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun-part shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Quickly reaches 12 in. tall, gradually spreading to form a dense mat.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen; 4 inch long velvety, chartreuse, soft, lamb's ear-shaped leaves with tiny white hairs
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers, but a light lilac flowers arise on stalks..
