

Bells of Fire Trumpetbush



Drought tolerant once its roots are well established, and a veritable magnet for butterflies, hummers, bees and a host of other pollinators!



Tecoma stans 'Bells of Fire'

- **Use:** A stunning compact variety - with fiery red-orange blooms. This heat and sun-loving shrub explodes with warm color from spring until the first frost. Self-cleaning, and rarely sets seed pods. Easy to grow in the landscape or in containers
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun preferred or at least 8 hours of afternoon sun. Very drought tolerant, but water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Continues to grow up to 3-4' tall and wide, possibly larger.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-11; Perennial, but needs Southern Exposure, good drainage, and a winter mulch layer helps.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; The foliage is green and upright, a larger fern appearance
- **Flower:** Big fat sprays of fragrant 3-4" trumpet flowers that bloom almost year-round on an evergreen bushy shrub. But 'Bells of Fire' turns it up to eleven with stunning blooms that are true scarlet red in spring and midsummer, and sunset orange from late summer until frost!
