

Yellow Trumpetbush



Anyone who has seen this plant in bloom can understand why one of its names is Yellow bells, as it produces great, attention-grabbing, yellow blossoms. In recent years, it has become a popular landscaping plant, valued as much for its drought-tolerance as for its spectacular appearance



Tecoma 'Lydia'

- **Use:** Vigorous, showy tropical bush with orange-red blossoms. Adds a splash of colors to hot patios and around the pool. This plant loves the heat! Unlike traditional varieties, Lydia blooms from early spring until frost, grows more compactly and has less seed pods.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun preferred or at least 8 hours of afternoon sun. Very drought tolerant, but water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Continues to grow up to 5-6' tall and wide, possibly larger.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-11; Perennial, but needs Southern Exposure, good drainage, and a winter mulch layer helps.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; jagged , green leaves
- **Flower:** Produces clusters of sunny, yellow tubular flowers, each about 2 in (5.1 cm) long from spring until fall.
