Tiarellas can be grown in containers and in the landscape anywhere that dappled to full shade can be provided. They pair beautifully with hostas and ferns. Tiarellas enjoy popularity thanks to their shade tolerance, unusual leaf shape, dramatically marked foliage, repeat flowering, and light fragrance.

- <u>Use:</u> A lovely, rapidly trailing groundcover which sports numerous branches. Well marked leaves have a large splatter pattern. Better marked than 'Running Tapestry'. A great groundcover for shade or in a hanging basket. Short white flowers. Vigorous without getting out of hand. Due to the long flowering period, this perennial is very attractive in both summer and autumn. A beautiful addition to the garden, perennial border, shade garden or the rock garden. Native to North America.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Prefers semi-shade (morning sun and afternoon shade best) and good drainage. Tolerates cold exposed locations;.
- Growth: Clumping foliage 4-6 in (in flower) tall, 36 in. wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-9; Perennial
- Foliage: Evergreen Green, heart-shaped leaves that display deep redpurple veining.
- Flower: Dense, upright racemes of fluffy, white flowers tipped in pink bloom from late spring into summer. However, its major advantage above other Tiarellas is the heat tolerance. The fruit is a small lopsided capsule that splits into two segments full of shiny black seed.
