Verbascum 'Honey Dijon'

- **Use:** These show stopping flowers are perfect for cutting for bouquets or arrangements! This is a sweet compact plant with a flower that displays shades of peach and gold with a plum eye. Did we say there are masses of these flowers? It's quite wonderful. We are firm believers in Verbascums for every garden, and love them not only for its mix of sophisticated colors, but because it's super simple to grow & almost everblooming. One of those wonderful plants that makes you feel very successful even though you've done absolutely nothing! It's perennial too! Drought tolerant, deer AND snail resistant – you just can't go wrong! - **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers. Good drainage is key with Verbascum.
- **Growth:** Full, well branched plants grow 8-14" tall and 18" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9 Perennial. Very heat tolerant! Mulch around plant in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Felted green-gray leaves in a rosette.
- **Flower:** Large, peach and gold colored blooms, with plum eyes, cover numerous spikes protruding above the compact, yet lovely, green foliage. Primary bloom begins in May-June and is followed by a lighter bloom period that continues into September. Remove spent flower spikes to encourage more blooms. It's no wonder why butterflies, hummingbirds, and other pollinators love these beautiful, eye-catching blooms. Even though they attract pollinators deer usually leave this plant alone.
