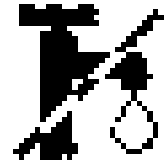


Meteor Shower Verbena/ Purpletop Vervain



An updated look for the species, Meteor Shower™ has a denser, more vigorous growth habit which equates to more manageable and attractive plants as a flowering thriller in containers and massed in the landscape.

And since the plants set little seed, it won't become invasive like most Verbenas of this type. Heat and drought tolerance and deer resistance sweeten its appeal.

Verbena bonariensis 'Meteor Shower'

- **Use:** A new dwarf form of *Verbena bonariensis* that grows to only 20-30 inches tall. Like the larger form this plant has a long bloom period with lilac flowers from spring through fall. A great plant for the front to middle planting of a border or wildflower meadow where it is sure to attract butterflies. Tolerates heat and dry conditions. More resistant to the powdery mildew that plagues the larger form. It has been indicated to us that this plant is possibly sterile as no seedlings have been noted, though further testing will be required before this claim can be made.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun-part sun. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Water when top 3" of soil is dry. Do not water center of the plant, try to water under the leaves. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 20-30" tall and 8-12" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7b-11, Perennial,
- **Foliage:** Deciduous feathered leaves.
- **Flower:** Lollipop lilac blooms from spring until fall. Great for pollinators. Grown using organic practices.
