## Perfectly Picasso Speedwell



Veronica is highly valued for its ease of growth and long bloom time. The spiky flowers are an excellent contrast to the more common rounded flower shapes like Shasta Daisies, Coneflower, and Black Eyed Susans. Expect bees to be buzzing about this plant when in bloom.



## Veronica 'Perfectly Picasso'

- <u>Use:</u> If you want stop-in-your-tracks beauty, look no further than 'Perfectly Picasso'. Paintbrush-like spikes produce white buds that open to medium pink flowers. The contrast between the buds and the flowers give this plant a unique bicolor look. Attractive flowers cover the top ½ of the plant, showing off its healthy medium green leaves on a beautifully rounded habit. This mediumheight Veronica would be perfect for the middle of the border. Pair this bicolor beauty with 'Royal Rembrandt'.
- **Exposure/Soil**: Any well drained soil in full to part sun will do.
- <u>Growth</u>: The plants are trailing, 22-26" tall and 22-24" wide.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 4-8 Perennial, Must be mulched in the winter.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous; elongated green foliage.
- Flower: Paint the garden with a bicolor palette of pink spikes opening from frosty silver-white buds. Flowers cover the top ½ of the plant's total height showcasing its beautiful upright rounded habit.
