

Waterperry Blue Veronica



A low-growing, long-flowering groundcover for the rock garden. Deep green leaves tinged with burgundy and copper overtones provide a lush backdrop for the dainty lavender-blue, dark-veined flowers with white eyes.

- **Use:** Neat tidy plants. Care free, beautiful in or out of flower. Not fussy. Grows like a ground cover and has beautiful, sky-blue flowers in early spring. It's an excellent choice for container plantings and rock gardens, too. It provides the visual appeal of a woodland stream spilling over the sides of containers or cascading over rocks.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Any well drained soil in full to part sun will do.
- **Growth:** The plants are trailing, 4-6" tall and 2 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial, Must be mulched in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen leaves are only about 1 inch long, elliptical shaped and finely toothed. They're dark green in summer and turn a burgundy-bronze in winter.
- **Flower:** Baby blue flowers. Cut back after spring blossoms for a repeat summer blooming.
