## *Veronica 'Whitewater'*

- **Use:** A delightful groundcover, forming a dense low carpet covered with dainty white flowers in spring and then in waves until frost. As weather cools, the glossy, deep green foliage takes on rich shades of bronze and burgundy, remaining evergreen in mild winter areas. Deer and rabbit resistant. This is an incredible plant to brighten up a dreary pathway. Works well in a woodland setting around ferns and hostas. Excellent as an under story planting for rhododendrons and azaleas. Also great as a lawn replacement or around slate.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Any well drained soil in part sun will do. Dislikes extreme drought, but otherwise tough and versatile.
- **Growth: Grows 4-6" H x 18-30" W**
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Perennial,
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen leaves in mild winters are only about 1 inch long, elliptical shaped and finely toothed.
- **Flower:** Tiny, pearly-white flowers in spring.
