

Rozannie Japanese Aucuba



Aucuba japonica 'Rozannie'

- **Use:** Bright red fruit forms on this compact Japanese aucuba selection even without a pollinizer. One of the Japanese aucubas great attributes is that it will grow well in shade, even deep shade and need little water once established. Best for adding interest to the fall and winter garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers well-drained soil, but will tolerate sandy soils or clay. Plant in dappled to deep shade as too much sun will cause the leaves to yellow and burn. Aucuba is quite drought tolerant once established, although occasional summer watering will keep it looking its best during prolonged dry weather.
- **Growth:** Slow-growing to 4 feet high, almost as wide in 10 years. (Expect mature height to top at around 6' tall and wide)
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6 –10; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. The glossy, dark green leaves has a few coarse-like teeth near the tip giving it a slight holly-like appearance, but definitely not as sharp.
- **Flower:** Insignificant male and female flowers on plant will produce colorful red berries however.
