

Gyokushin Azalea



An excellent understory species beneath canopy of pines and other trees

Azalea(Rhododendron) 'Gyokushin' (Satsuki type)

- **Use:** A Satsuki hybrid bearing white flowers with a heavily contrasted fuchsia center in spring. Compact plant great for small spaces.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Morning sun and afternoon shade is best. Tolerant of a wide range of growing conditions as any azalea, although all azaleas grow best in a well drained soil and in filtered sunlight. Pruning is sometime required on plants that grow quite large.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower 2 ft. tall and 3' wide. Prune immediately after flowering to shape the plant and remove any spindly stems. Do not prune in summer, fall, or winter, as this will remove next year's flower buds.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Small, green leaves that are 1/2 to 2 inches long.
- **Flower:** Three inch flowers are white with occasional pink flecks and light green blotches. Occasionally, the same plant may produce all-pink flowers. A late spring bloomer.
