- <u>Use:</u> A rounded, compact habit makes this Buddleia a perfect fit for a variety of uses. Lavender flowers are formed in early summer and continue to rebloom into the fall. Spent flowers are hidden by new blooms, reducing the need for deadheading. It is also drought-tolerant, attracts pollinators, and resists deer and rabbits.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Cold, wet winters can be really hard on buddleia, so here are a few tips to help your buddleia thrive in your garden: 1. Make sure the soil is well-drained. That place where the plow truck dumps snow in the winter? Not a good idea. 2. Full sun. That's at least 6 hours. No cheating. 3. Wait until it leafs out in spring before pruning. In some years you may have to prune it back to the ground. After milder winters, maybe not so much. Avoid fall pruning.
- **Growth**: Moderate grower to 3-4 feet tall and 3-4 feet wide. Deadhead often for best reblooming.
- Hardiness: Zone 5 -9 Shrub
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Silvery green foliage.
- <u>Flower:</u> Lavender flowers are formed in early summer and continue to rebloom into the fall. Spent flowers are hidden by new blooms, reducing the need for deadheading.
