Compact; reblooming; non-invasive; droughttolerant

- <u>Use:</u> Just like her sisters, 'Miss Molly' and 'Miss Ruby', 'Miss Violet' is a compact plant with vibrant flower color, but with loads of dark purple-violet summer flowers. Seedless and non-invasive; deer resistant, too! Winner of a Green Thumb award from the Direct Gardening Association. This non-invasive variety thrives in hot climates. Butterflies and hummingbirds will find it as irresistible as you do!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Cold, wet winters can be really hard on buddleia, so here are a few tips to help your buddleia thrive in your garden: 1. Make sure the soil is well-drained. Not a good idea. 2. Full sun. That's at least 6 hours. No cheating. 3. Wait until it leafs out in spring before pruning. In some years you may have to prune it back to the ground. After milder winters, maybe not so much. Avoid fall pruning.
- **Growth**: Moderate grower to 4-5' feet wide. Deadhead often for best reblooming.
- Hardiness: Zone 5 -9 Shrub
- Foliage: Deciduous. Silvery green foliage.
- <u>Flower:</u> Nonstop large 1' long almost electric violet flower heads from May until frost.
