It is also drought-tolerant, attracts pollinators, and resists deer and rabbits.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Cold, wet winters can be really hard on buddleia, so here are a few tips to help your buddleia thrive in your garden: 1. Make sure the soil is well-drained. That place where the plow truck dumps snow in the winter? Not a good idea. 2. Full sun. That's at least 6 hours. No cheating. 3. Wait until it leafs out in spring before pruning. In some years you may have to prune it back to the ground. After milder winters, maybe not so much. Avoid fall pruning.
- <u>Growth</u>: Moderate grower to 2-3 feet tall and 2-3 feet wide. Deadhead often for best reblooming.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 5 -9 Shrub
 - *Foliage*: Deciduous. Silvery green foliage.
 - *Flower:* Sturdy spires of purple-blue fragrant flowers each dotted with a tiny orange eye bloom non-stop from early summer through frost.
