

Honeycomb Butterfly Bush



Long-blooming shrub and very easy to grow! This beauty is an unusual color for butterfly bushes.



Buddleia x weyeriana 'Honeycomb'

- **Use:** Honeycomb creates a stunning spectacle in the garden with golden flower clusters that emit a honey-like scent. Best grown in small groups or in massed plantings in borders, cottage gardens or butterfly gardens. Attracts butterflies and is deer resistant. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun to part sun; moist, well drained soil; dislikes wet sites. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 5 to 6 feet tall and 4 to 6 feet wide. Deadhead often for rebloom.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6 -9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Lance-shaped silvery leaves (to 8" long).
- **Flower:** Fragrant orange-eyed deep yellow flowers
- Butterflies are attracted to the heavily scented nectar Occurring in late summer early fall
