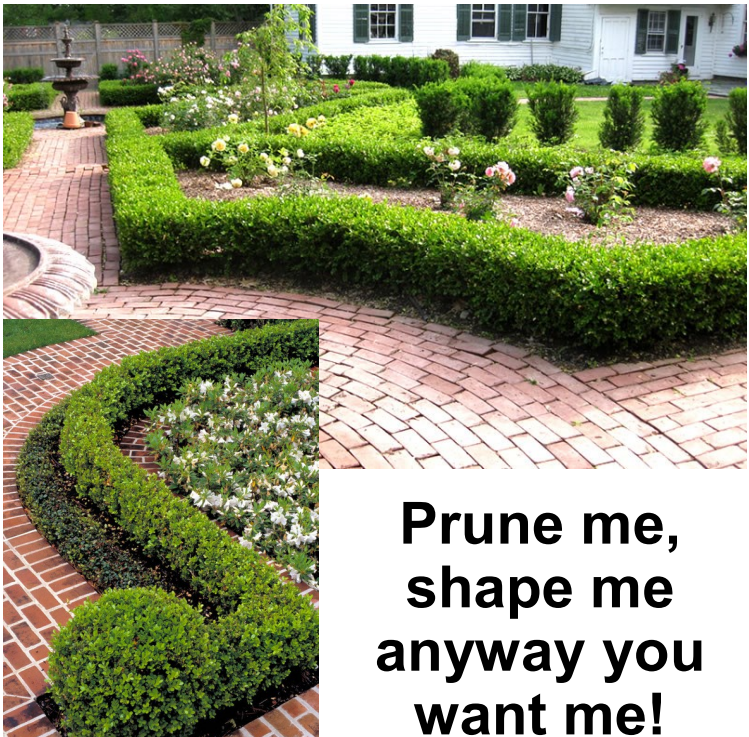


Annie's Dwarf Japanese Boxwood

Buxus microphylla japonica 'Annie's Dwarf'

- **Use:** This fine-textured broadleaved evergreen grows as tall as it is wide, reaching a maintainable size of 3 feet and resembling a little green muffin. It's an exceptionally compact boxwood excellent for use in smaller gardens for borders and focal areas. The moderate rate of growth makes these boxwoods ideal for care-free edging in a wide area of the US. Other splendid characteristics include deer resistance and tolerance of dry soils once established. A new introduction from a South Georgia grower.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part shade. Keep surface of soil moist, but not soggy.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 3 ft. tall and wide, when unpruned.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-10; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Densely branched, the tiny, green foliage is abundant and adds a distinctive note to the landscape, retaining its color particularly well in winter.
- **Flower:** Spring flowers are inconspicuous.
