

Justin Brouwers Dwarf Boxwood



The perfect choice for use as a low formal hedge or border edger in the landscape, or for planting under low windows or to line paths and walkways in home foundation plantings. Excellent for use in pots, planters and other containers with a diameter of 12 inches or more. A fine addition to Asian or English gardens and formal gardens. Excellent for bonsai.

Buxus sinica var. insularis 'Justin Brouwers'

- **Use:** Small, dark green, glossy leaves maintain their color year-round, unlike many boxwood that tend to bronze in winter. 'Justin Brouwers' responds well to shearing and is attractive as an individual specimen or part of a highly manicured border, low hedge, or parterre. Left un-sheared it will become an attractive garden feature that is wider than tall. With pruning it can be kept in a globe shape. Its exceptional sun tolerance and small deep-green leaves makes it a great substitute for the popular English Boxwood, which is known to suffer from too much sun.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part shade. Keep surface of soil moist, but not soggy.
- **Growth:** Slow annual growth (to 1-3" in height per year), however height may obviously be controlled by pruning. Typically grown as a 2' tall and 2' wide shrub.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-8; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Small, obovate, medium green leaves (to 5/8" long). This cultivars does not bronze in the winter and holds it's green color.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers.
