

# Lavender Prince II Camellia



Gorgeous flowers brighten the winter landscape!

Originated by Dr Clifford Parks, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, USA. The 17 year old seedling first bloomed in 1967.

**Camellia 'Lavender Prince II'** (([*C.saluenensis* x *C.japonica* William's Lavender] x *C.japonica* Princess Lavender)

- **Use:** Rose orchid pink with yellow anthers and cream filaments. Camellias make a wonderful shade loving hedge for winter color.
- **Exposure:** Thrives in partial sun (Morning Sun), but may tolerate full sun with good irrigation, excellent soil (and some work/needs irrigation!), Must amend the soil! They hate red clay! Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Can grow 8-10' tall and 6-8' wide. Space plants 4'-5' apart to create a hedge. We have successfully kept them to 3' tall in our gardens though. Prune only right after blooms fade as they can set buds 9 months in advance.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6a-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Shiny, rich dark green leaves.
- **Flower:** A large, china rose, semi-double C.hybrid. Average flower size is 4" and 2" deep with 12 petals, yellow anthers and cream filaments.
