

Camellia 'Daikagura'



With a moderate growth rate, and erect habit, it has a somewhat coarse texture. "Great Sacred Dance" (trans.) is a well-known cultivar dating back to 1788.

Camellia japonica 'Daikagura'

- **Use:** Spectacular, rose pink, peony blooms splotted with white. Flowers make a great contrast with the glossy, dark green foliage. A prized plant of the milder regions of the U.S.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, sunny or shade, and any well drained neutral/acid soil.
- **Growth:** Slow growing to 6 to 8 ft. tall and wide, larger with age.
- **Hardiness:** 6-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen.
- **Flower:** An early-blooming variety producing large, red peony form double flowers. It has proven to be highly variable, and named mutant forms have originated from it. Early season bloomer. Prune only right after blooms fade.
