Camellia japonica 'Dorothy Zerkowski'

- <u>Use:</u> An extremely rare and beautiful late blooming Camellia japonica variety, features large, semi double to double or peony form bicolor flowers with pink petals that gradually transition to white around the edges. Can be grown as a large shrub or lower branches can be removed to form a highly attractive evergreen tree. The 5-inch diameter flowers are perfect for cutting and enjoying indoors in a vase or floating in a bowl. Get all the details below A must have for every Southern garden to add winter interest. Also makes an excellent hedge.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, sunny or shade, and any <u>well drained</u> neutral/acid soil. Extreme summer heat may cause leaf burn; needs some shade if planted near a white house due to reflection of sun.
- **Growth:** Low growing to 8-12ft. tall and 6-8' wide, larger with age. Prune only withing a month of flower finishing as they set buds 9 month in advance for following season.
- Hardiness: Zone 6-9; Shrub
- Foliage: Evergreen, Glossy, dark green foliage
- <u>Flower:</u> Large 4-5" soft blush pink, peony-like blooms. Blooms begin to appear in March in our north-central Georgia gardens. <u>Prune only right after blooms fade.</u>
