
E.G. Waterhouse Camellia







Tolerates heat and humidity well! We love using them as a shade loving hedge in shade with winter blooms.

Camellia japonica 'E.G. Waterhouse'

- <u>Use:</u> A winner of the Camellia Hall of Fame Award! The medium-sized, perfect or rose form flowers are fuchsia on the outer petals lightening to light pink in the center are produced in mid to late season or January to April. Even when not in bloom, the large, glossy, evergreen, dark green leaves provide outstanding texture in the landscape. Excellent for cutting and use in indoor flower arrangements or just float one in a bowl of water.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, prefers a little bit of shade form afternoon sun, and any well drained neutral/acid soil.
- <u>Growth</u>: Moderate growing to 9 to 12 ft. tall and wide, and 6-9 feet wide at the base forming an upside down cone. Space at 5-6' wide to make a solid hedge and 12'+ apart for freestanding shrubs.
- Hardiness: Zone 7a-9b; Shrub
- *Foliage:* Evergreen; Large, glossy, dark green leaves provide a perfect backdrop for the flowers.
- <u>Flower</u>: Produces an abundance of perfectly formed, absolutely gorgeous formal double flowers with true pink petals from mid winter to mid spring. Flowers begin to appear in January or February and continue through April! <u>Prune only right after blooms fade.</u>
