Gorgeous flowers that are deer resistant and bring interest to the winter garden!



Camellia japonica 'Frank Brownlee'

- **Use:** A very rare Camellia introduced back in 1959, 'Frank Brownlee' sports large, double, smoldering deep red flowers with very wavy petals that surround yellow stamens. The glossy pointy leaves remain dark green throughout the winter. Camellias are used as specimen large shrubs, shrub borders and screens. The main ornamental feature is their showy flowers in colder winter months when other plants are dormant.
- **Exposure:** Thrives in either full sun with good irrigation (and some work), but prefers partial sun (Morning Sun) . Must amend the soil! As they hate red clay! Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Can grow 6-12' tall and wide. Space plants 4'-6' apart to create a hedge.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Shiny, rich dark green leaves.
- **Flower:** Red with white flecks double.
