

Magnoliaeflora Camellia



Camellia japonica 'Magnoliaeflora'

- **Use:** Magnoliaeflora or Hagoroma Camellia is a compact, smaller-growing Camellia with a nice dense and compact habit. A beautiful and reliable Heirloom variety originally from Japan where it was known as Hagoromo which translates to 'feathered robe'.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, prefers a little bit of shade from afternoon sun, and any well drained neutral/acid soil.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing to 6 to 8 ft tall and 6 to 8 ft. wide, larger with age. Prune immediately after flowering.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone** 6-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Dark and glossy green leaves offer a healthy, rich look you'll love.
- **Flower:** Spectacular, blush pink, semi-double blooms. Clip off your favorite, fresh florals and bring them inside for centerpieces, gifts and more. Plus, they're wonderful when planted and placed by the patio, pool or porch since their sweet scent enchants year after year. Prune only right after blooms fade.

Its buds and flowers are resistant to cold temperatures, thus flowering is able to occur in mid January, a tad earlier than many other japonicas. Named due to its off white magnolia formed semi-double flowers. It's petals have a distinctive curl and can sometimes resemble a star.
