Camellia japonica 'Miss Biloxi'

- **Use:** Introduced by R. H. Brodie of Biloxi, Mississippi in 1956. A slower growing type it would work well as a low hedge, in containers, or as a specimen. A must for the Southern shade garden.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, prefers a little bit of shade form afternoon sun, and any well drained neutral/acid soil.
- **Growth:** Slow-moderate growing to 6 to 8 ft. tall and wide, larger with age.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7b-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Vigorous, compact, upright, evergreen shrub, valued for small pale green foliage.
- **Flower:** Pearl white, rose-form double to peony, medium (3-4"). Admired for its pure white, formal double blooms from December through March. Prune only right after blooms fade.
