

Mrs. Bertha A. Harms Camellia



Camellia japonica 'Mrs Bertha A Harms'

- **Use:** Beautiful shrub to add interest to your winter garden. Flowers are set against deep green foliage. Its upright vigorous habit makes it a choice camellia as a specimen plant. The sensational blossoms can be used as a corsage or floated in a bowl of water to add beauty to any room.
- **Exposure:** Prefers sheltered site, prefers morning sun and a little bit of shade from afternoon sun, and any well drained neutral/acid soil.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing to 10 to 12 ft. tall and wide, and 6-8 feet wide at the base.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7b-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Glossy dark green, ovate leaves with finely serrated edges.
- **Flower:** Very large, 4" + ivory white blooms in late winter. May have a faint pink tint. Prune only right after blooms fade.

Tolerates heat and humidity well! We love to plant them in large hedges for year round beauty in part shade.
