Camellia japonica 'Sandra Williams'

- **Use:** Flowers make a dazzling contrast with the glossy, dark green foliage. An old time favorite that adds winter to early spring interest in the garden. This 20-year old *C. japonica* chance seedling first bloomed in 1996. It was originated and propagated by Jay Ellis of Keystone Heights, Florida.
- **Exposure:** Thrives in either full sun with good irrigation, but prefers part shade. Must amend the soil! Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 10' tall and 8' wide. Upright and dense with vigorous growth rate and has landscape possibilities.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Light green leaves are 2.5 x 1.25 inches.
- **Flower:** The 2.5" dark pink to medium red anemone has variegation with yellow anthers. The bloom has unique color with consistent form and is a profuse bloomer. Won two best seedling awards.
