Camellia sasanqua 'Elaine Lee'

- **Use:** Camellias are used as specimens, shrub borders and screens. The main ornamental feature is their showy flowers in colder winter months when other plants are dormant. The leaves of Sasanqua Camellias are much smaller and dense than the Japanese Camellias, making for a smaller more compact shrub, but still a suitable hedge.
- **Exposure:** Thrives in either full sun with good irrigation (and some work), but prefers partial sun (Morning Sun) . Must amend the soil! As they hate red clay! Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Averaging a mature height of 5-6 feet and a width of 3 feet Only prune right after they bloom or you will cut out next year's flowers. Space plants 5-6' apart to create a hedge.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Shiny, rich dark green leaves.
- **Flower:** Hardy white, semi-double bloom in fall just as your gardens and landscape start to quiet down. Blooms late fall (November – January)



Upright habit with a small to medium, loose, semi-double white flowers appearing early in the fall. Make an excellent hedge.
