Camellia sasanqua 'Marti'

- **Use:** Camellias are used as specimen shrubs, shrub borders and screens. The main ornamental feature is their showy flowers in colder winter months when other plants are dormant. Similar to *Camellia japonica* but tends to be smaller and more refined. Smaller leaves. Heavy bud set.
- **Exposure:** Thrives in partial sun (Morning Sun), but may tolerate full sun with good irrigation, excellent soil (and some work!), . Must amend the soil! They hate red clay! Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Can grow 10-15' tall and 8-10' wide. Space plants 6-8' apart to create a hedge.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7a-9b; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Shiny, rich dark green leaves.
- **Flower:** In fall, she puts on a fantastic color show displaying abundant and very pretty single to slightly semi-double 2 to 3 inch clematis-like flowers with bubblegum-pink petals. The somewhat crepe-like petals surround a prominent boss of bright yellow stamens.
