Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Korean Gold'

- <u>Use:</u> An upright, vase-shaped conifer with very long yellow-green foliage arranged radially around ascending branches. A very unique and beautiful conifer that has a subtropical appearance. A hard to find collector item that would be useful in a shady container.
- Exposure/Soil: Morning sun and afternoon shade recommended in the South; moist, well drained soil; <u>dislikes wet sites</u>. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- <u>Growth</u>: May in time reach 6-10 ft tall and 3-6 ft wide (1.8-3.0 × 0.9 -1.8 m), but it is slow growing, possibly only 3 ft tall after 10 years
- Hardiness: Zone 6 -9 Shrub
- **Foliage**: Evergreen. The needles are dark green at the bottom and much lighter at the top, they emerge vivid golden yellow and mature almost lime green.
- <u>Flower:</u> Insignificant flowers. Female plants produce red, yew-like fruit with edible flesh and inedible seeds. The fruit is not as attractive or tasty as on common yews.
