- <u>Use:</u> You'll do a double take when you see this quince that looks like a camellia. The Double Take quinces are more than just pretty spring flowers: thornless and deer-resistant, they do not produce fruit, and once established, are drought-tolerant survivalists. Developed by Dr. Tom Ranney and his team at the Mountain Horticultural Crops Research & Extension Center in beautiful North Carolina, the Double Take quinces are sure to brighten spring landscapes across the United States.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun to light shade. Flowering is best in full sun. Tolerant of most soils including very dry soils.
- **Growth**: Moderate growing 4 to 5 feet tall by 4 to 5 feet wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 5-9, Shrub
- *Foliage:* Semi-evergreen. Small green leaves.
 - Flower: Double orange flowers in late winter/ early spring. Sterile/ no fruit.
