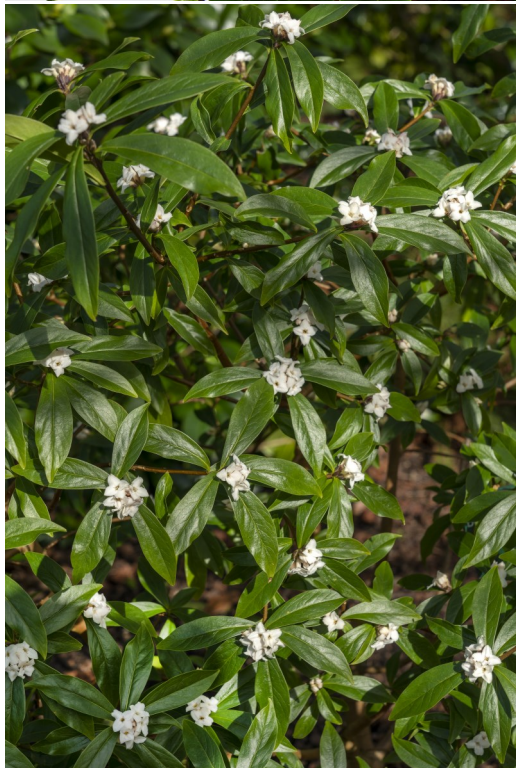


White Perfume Princess™ Pink Daphne

- **Use:** 'Perfume Princess White' is a chance mutation of Perfume Princess. Like its parent, it blooms early and long. This stunning plant is much showier than most daphne, setting extra-large (4x larger) clusters along each branch, rather than just at the tips. Shown to best effect when massed or grouped, the shrub is perfect for beds, borders, and foundation plantings. It is ideal for loose or clipped hedges. And it is also an excellent choice for a container garden. A flowering evergreen shrub offering year-round interest, blooming heavily from mid-winter to late spring, with possible sporadic summer blooms. It has won numerous awards for being one of the easiest to grow Daphne on the market for disease resistance.
- **Exposure/Soil:** **WHILE WE LOVE DAPHNE IT IS NOT A PLANT FOR BEGINNERS. THEY MUST HAVE GOOD SOIL AND EXCELLENT DRAINAGE. MORNING SUN/AFTERNOON SHADE IS ALSO A MUST IN GA.** Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system. Honestly, without an irrigation system you can lose them in the summer. Feed with a general purpose fertilizer before new growth begins in spring. Soil must be amended with a rich organic matter or peat based soil. **Will not tolerate red clay.** For a tidy, neat appearance, shear annually to shape. Prune after blooms have faded. Be gentle with rootball when transplanting.
- **Growth:** Slow growing; reaches 4 ft. tall and 3' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. The glossy, deep green leaves are very attractive and add vivid color and texture to the garden all year.
- **Flower:** Deliciously fragrant white flowers emerge in Mid-Winter and continue through Spring. Blooms along the stem as well as at each branch tip. The sweet-scented flowering stems make excellent cuts for floral displays that will perfume a room.
