

Jewel Box Witch Hazel



They are an outstanding alternative to commonly used species such as cherry laurels, junipers, hollies, Indian hawthorn, and even boxwood.

Distylium 'Jewel Box'

- **Use:** Attractive, soft, blue-green fine textured foliage with a compact, rounded habit makes Jewel Box a great alternative to Boxwood or Holly. Use in mass plantings, borders or hedges.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grows in full to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Will tolerate wet soil.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-3' tall and 3-4' wide with layered branches are held in graceful, arching sweeps. For a seamless planting, plant your Jewel Box Distylium 2-3 feet apart. Otherwise, space them 4-5+ feet apart to leave space between shrubs.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-10 ; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Attractive, soft, blue-green fine textured foliage
- **Flower:** Small reddish / maroon flowers begin to appear in late winter, lasting for several weeks.
