

Purple Leaf Wintercreeper



Excellent ground cover. Perfect for large area coverage, hillsides and areas not easily accessed for care.



Euonymus fortunei coloratus

- **Use:** The hardiest of the many selection of Japanese Euonymus. Plants form a dense carpet of dark green leaves with a coarse to medium texture. Prune the growth tips in midsummer for the first few years, to encourage branching.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full to part sun, but will grow in shade. Place in full sun for best foliage color. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Space 1 to 3 plants per square yard. Fast grower. Can be trained as a climbing vine, growing to 20 feet or more.
- **Hardiness:** 5-9 Vine
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Foliage turns dusky purple during the colder months but remains evergreen except in very cold regions.
- **Flower:** This plant has greenish-white, inconspicuous flowers that occur from May until June.
