Late season color for hedges, perennial or shrub borders, specimen and containers. This is a nice addition to the mixed border, and can also be used as a specimen plant for late summer interest. Excellent for hedging.



Hibiscus (Althea) syriacus 'Paraplu Rouge'

- **Use:** These are the deepest, darkest reddish-pink blooms we've ever seen on a rose of Sharon! Plus, the blooms themselves are quite large. With this duo of characteristics, your garden is sure to stand out on the block. Graceful habit that moves in the breeze - not stiff and awkward like other roses of Sharon. Long blooming and low maintenance, so you can just enjoy the season. No need to worry about the deer browsing around this deer resistant shrub. Rose of Sharon makes for great borders, hedges, or as a stand-alone specimen shrub in well-drained soil.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun in ordinary soil. To increase bloom and to shape, prune to 2 buds per branch when dormant. Prefers to be watered under the leaves.
 - **Growth:** Grows 6-10' tall and 5' wide.
 - **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9 Large Shrub Very heat tolerant!
 - **Foliage:** Deciduous; Medium green maple-like leaves.
- Flower:** There is not a lot of red to offer in the Rose of Sharon family, so when PARAPLU ROUGE™ was discovered, featuring deep magenta red blooms with a bright red eye, it became the closest to red on the market! PARAPLU ROUGE™ has large flowers that bloom mid to late summer.
