

Sugar Tip® Rose of Sharon



Summer color, hedges or screens, perennial or shrub borders, specimen and containers. May be planted in a container as a patio plant and then transplanted into the ground in fall.

- **Use:** Colorful foliage all season, and fluffy pink blooms in summer! Fabulous and eye-catching from spring to fall, Sugar Tip rose of Sharon offers unique brightly variegated creamy-white and bluish-green foliage. It produces loads of clear pink, double flowers and does not produce seed. This is a beautiful semi-dwarf rose of Sharon that saves space and looks great all summer.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun in ordinary soil. To increase bloom and to shape, prune to 2 buds per branch when dormant. Prefers to be watered under the leaves.
- **Growth:** Grows 5-6' tall and 4-6' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5a-9 Shrub/ Small Tree. Very heat tolerant!
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Medium variegated white and bluish maple-like leaves.
- **Flower:** Wonderful fully pink flowers, each packed with lots of slightly ruffled petals in summer to fall. The fully double blooms do not set seed.
