

Invincibelle Garnetta Hydrangea



Hydrangea arborescens 'Invincibelle Garnetta'

- **Use:** Lusciously full mophead pink flowers are only one of the qualities that make Invincibelle Garnetta hydrangea so special. It also boasts supportive, sturdy stems (no blooms laying on the ground here!), a useful compact size, and reblooming ability for months instead of mere weeks of flowers. Blooming a bit later than the rest of the Invincibelle series, it's a fantastic season-extender.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in a part sun, well-drained spot; some early afternoon shade is beneficial in hot southern regions. Prune in late winter or early spring. Soil pH does not affect flower color.
- **Growth:** It reaches just 2.5' tall and wide; naturally grows as a tidy, rounded mound.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3a-8a; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Coarsely toothed, glossy, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** Offers deep garnet-hued buds that open into lush pink blooms. It flowers a bit later than others in the series, which makes it an ideal season-extender and companion to the other fabulous varieties in the series. Summer blooming with a fall repeat.
