Hydrangea arborescens subsp. radiata 'SMNHRL' PP33290

- **Use:** Some people adore lacecap flowers for their delicate beauty, while others appreciate the pollen for butterflies and bees. This premiere plant, the first ever smooth hydrangea with plum-purple lacy florets, accomplishes both, with strong, wiry stems of a dark ruby hue, that sway gracefully with the wind. Imagine big drifts, flowing through a Piet Oudolf-style garden, and come winter, frosted diamonds and songbirds adorning tawny crowns.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in a part sun, well-drained spot; some early afternoon shade is beneficial in hot southern regions. Prune in late winter or early spring. Soil pH does not affect flower color.
 - **Growth:** Grows 4-5" tall and wide; naturally grows as a tidy, rounded mound.
 - **Hardiness:** Zone 3a-8; Shrub
 - **Foliage:** Deciduous. Coarsely toothed, glossy, dark-green leaves.
 - **Flower:** Gorgeous plum-purple lacecap flowers and dark ruby hued stems. They last clear through frost for a persistent show that takes practically no effort on your part. The strong stems make cutting easy, and the blossoms are a wonder in fresh and dried bouquets. Plum purple florets are both pretty AND beneficial to pollinators.
