1. The only dwarf 'Annabelle' hydrangea in the world.
2. Strong stems hold the flowers upright, even after summer storms.

Hydrangea arborescens 'Invincibelle Wee White'

- **Use:** It's the first dwarf 'Annabelle' type hydrangea in the world! This cute little landscape plant ensures that any landscape can enjoy the reliability, low-maintenance, and season-long beauty of hydrangeas. Versatile and floriferous, it just might be the solution to your landscape problems. Winner of the 2018 Direct Gardening Association Green Thumb award; available in better garden centers in spring 2018.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in a part sun, well-drained spot; some early afternoon shade is beneficial in hot southern regions. Prune in late winter or early spring. Soil pH does not affect flower color.
- **Growth:** It reaches just 1-2.5' (.3-.7 m) tall and naturally grows as a tidy, rounded mound.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Coarsely toothed, glossy, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** Each pure-white flower is held up on a strong, supportive stem for a display that looks more like a bouquet of flowers than a landscape plant. Blooming begins in early summer and continues through frost, with new flowers appearing the whole time.
