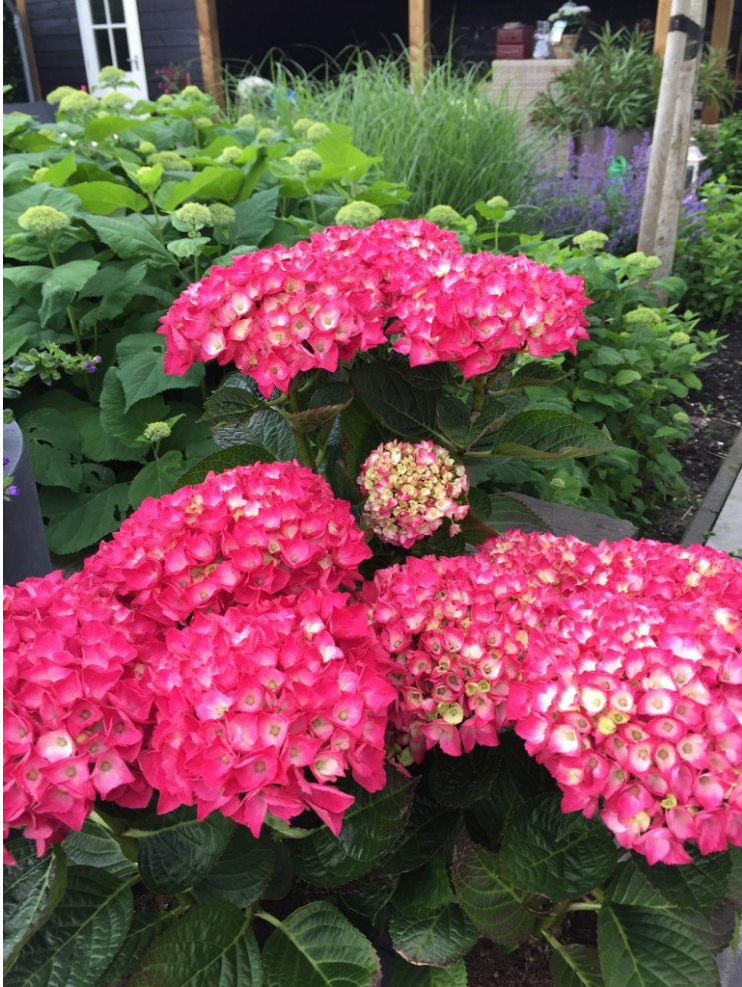


Everlasting Crimson Hydrangea



Keep plenty in the garden to attract butterflies, but do try some fresh or dried cut flowers—it performs so well in a vase.

Hydrangea macrophylla 'Hortmagicri'

- **Use:** This amazing selection is an ideal fit for the Everlasting series. A compact grower, whose apple green, lace-edged flowers open with a tinge of red. But, like a chameleon running from green apples to cherries, the blooms quickly become red all over, making this the acclaimed red variety in the Everlasting® line! Crimson comes with a promise to delight you throughout the entire season. Strong stems and dark green leaves provide the perfect foil for ever-changing colors. Crimson ages to green with red highlights – a pleasing combination as the summer fades and nights begin to cool.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Partial sun is best or at least protection from hot afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off leaves. **DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN!** When grown in acid soils, the flower color is lavender.
- **Growth:** Grows 18-36" / 18-36"
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Large heart shaped leaves. The fall color of the foliage is burgundy when the cool weather comes on long and slow.
- **Flower:** Blooms on old and new wood so more flowers! The blooms will transition through beautiful colors like apple green and bright pink...and then the really impressive rich, deep red in late summer. When all the other summer showstoppers are fading, this one gives you a blast of color in a difficult shade to find on hydrangea. You don't get a rich red on a hydrangea easily.
